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15 16 17	WHEREAS, the current Federal transportation authorization legislation Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST Act) continues the Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program (Section 5310 Program); and		
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19 20	WHEREAS, in 2013, the Governor appointed Milwaukee County (the County) as the sole designated recipient for the Section 5310 Program funds in the Milwaukee		
21	urbanized area that includes Ozaukee, Washington, and Waukesha Counties; and		
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23	WHEREAS, the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) was authorized by the		
24	United States Congress to allocate Federal Fiscal Year 2017 and 2018 Section 5310		
25	Program funds to the Milwaukee urbanized area, under the 2017 Consolidated		
26	Appropriations Act (Public Law 115-31) and the 2018 Consolidated Appropriations Act		
27	(Public Law 115-141), in the amounts of \$1,200,247 and \$1,217,916 respectively; and		
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29	WHEREAS, the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission		
30	(SEWRPC), through a competitive grant solicitation process completed		
31	September 17, 2018, has evaluated and determined the eligibility requirements of the		
32	Section 5310 Program grant applicants, and accordingly, has recommended awards in		
33	the Milwaukee urbanized area for calendar year 2019; and
