
Over a decade ago, in May 2008, the Public Policy Forum (now known as Wisconsin Policy Forum) issued a report.


At that time, the President of the Public Policy Forum often stated publicly that there was a County funds gap between farebox, State/Federal assistance and actual costs. "Our analysis of the Milwaukee County Transit System's fiscal situation indicates a striking structural imbalance that has been building for years, caused by disparity between revenue growth and operating expenditure needs. Thanks to a spend-down of significant reserves that were built up in the late 1990s, and a decision to defer needed bus replacements, a full-fledged crisis has been averted for the past eight years. But now, barring a significant infusion of federal funds to help pay for bus replacements, it appears time is about to run out."


