Repeal of 2015 Act 55 Land Sale Provisions

The Marcus Center revealed plans for an ambitious campus renovation in December 2018. Most controversial among the proposed changes is the removal of the grove of chestnut trees designed by Dan Kiley. This has resulted in an application for historic designation and great debate about the merits of the proposed design changes versus preservation. Within the debate the question of who has authority and charge over this public asset has been raised many times.

Some want the County Board of Supervisors to go on record on the issue of historic designation for the Marcus Center. This debate renews interest in correcting an anomaly in state statute created in the 2015 state biennial budget bill known as Act 55 which impacted only Milwaukee County. As you know, because of that legislative change, you alone possess authority over county land and buildings such as the Marcus Center that are not zoned parkland and the County Board has no authority on the issue.

You have stated that you would welcome the County Board weighing in on the Marcus Center designation. I take that sentiment as a reflection on our recent successes in working together and instead suggest that you join the County Board in supporting repeal of the 2015 Act 55 provisions that shifted the balance of power between the Executive and Legislative branch in Milwaukee County on issues affecting public properties that are not zoned parkland (please see attached Resolution 17-287 which was adopted unanimously). The Act 55 provisions also created numerous conflicts that remain unresolved to this day. The legislature did attempt to repeal all of the 2015 Act 55 provisions at issue here in the 2017 budget bill, Act 59, but Governor Scott Walker vetoed that action.

Rather than asking the County Board to participate in an advisory capacity on issues of public policy that impact public assets, work with us to restore in Milwaukee the same authority granted to all other counties in Wisconsin.

We can and should fix this statutory anomaly together!

A RESOLUTION

In support of the repeal of the provisions included in 2015 Wisconsin Act 55 related to the scope of County Board and County Executive authority

WHEREAS, 2015, Wisconsin Act 55 ("Act 55") amended Wis. Stat. § 59.17(2)(b)3 and delegated to the County Executive, rather than to the County Board, the authority to exercise those powers enumerated under Wis. Stat. § 59.52(6); and

WHEREAS, because the subsections of Wis. Stat. § 59.52 define the powers of the County Board, not the County Executive, many of the powers described under Wis. Stat. § 59.52(6) overlap with other powers of the County Board described under various other subsections of Wis. Stat. § 59.52;

WHEREAS, as a result, Act 55 created irreconcilable conflicts in the Wisconsin State Statutes related to the definition of the powers of the County Executive and the County Board; and

WHEREAS, in a report dated March 3, 2017, the Office of Corporation Counsel (OCC) provided a written opinion (File No. 17-274) affirming the existence of these conflicts, stating that the provisions contained in Act 55 "cannot be reconciled by the Office of Corporation Counsel ("OCC") because in doing so, the OCC would be forced to decide the fundamental balance of powers between the board and the executive in Milwaukee County, which in turn would usurp the state legislature's function": and

WHEREAS, the OCC identified the following irreconcilable conflicts created by Act 55, including, but not limited to:

- Section 59.52(6)(b), which grants to the County Executive the power to "make all orders concerning county property," which is extremely broad language that does not seem to reconcile with other subsections of 59.52. such as 59.52(2)-(4), (14) (addressing county records), 59.52(11) (insurance), 59.52(19) (donations and gifts), 59.52(23) (reference materials), and 59.52(24) (parking on county lands); and
- Section 59.52(6)(b), which grants to the executive the power "to commence and maintain actions," but does not reconcile with section 59.52(12), which grants to the board the power to "[e]xamine and settle ... all claims, demands, or causes of action against the county and issue county orders therefor"; and
- Section 59.52(6)(d)2, which appears to grant the County Executive unilateral authority to issue revenue bonds under 66.0621, while section

47 66.0621 requires County Board approval to issue bonds on behalf of the 48 county; and 49 50 Section 59.17(2)(b)3, which grants the County Executive the power to 51 "s[ell], acqui[re], or lease as landlord or tenant" any non-park county property, notwithstanding Wis. Stat. § 59.60(12), which mandates County 52 53 Board review of any "contract, lease or other obligation requiring the 54 payment of funds from the appropriations of a later fiscal year or of more 55 than one fiscal year" 56 57 ; and 58 59 WHEREAS, because the OCC is unable to reconcile these conflicts, the OCC 60 thus recommended that these conflicts be resolved "through an opinion from the state 61 Attorney General, a declaratory judgment action, and/or legislation."; and 62 63 64

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors believes that the repeal of the provisions of Act 55, described above, provide the clearest, most expeditious method by which to de-conflict the statutes; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby urges and supports repeal of all of the provisions included as part of 2015 Wisconsin Act related to the scope of County Board and County Executive authority; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors authorize and direct the Milwaukee County Government Affairs Staff to send a copy of this resolution to the Wisconsin State Legislature and lobby to effectuate the repeal of the provisions contained in 2015 Wisconsin Act 55.
