Subject: Retroactive Authorization to Apply for 2020 WDNR Stewardship and Federal Recreational Trails

**Grants (ACTION)** 

#### Issue

Milwaukee County Parks continuously works to identify and apply for grant funding to contribute to systemwide needs. Both the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Stewardship Program and the Federal Recreational Trails program have application windows in May-June of 2020, and Parks requests retroactive permission to apply to each.

## **Background**

One the of the most popular assets of the Milwaukee County Parks System is the Oak Leaf Trail (OLT) that extends across the County. Parks has targeted two key trail projects along the OLT this year for trail grant applications in 2020. Each project is a priority concern because of direct impact to the public's health, safety, and welfare while using segments of the OLT.

The Stewardship Program is designed to facilitate and promote nature-based outdoor recreation. Nature-based outdoor recreation consists of activities whose primary purpose is the appreciation or enjoyment of nature. Examples include hunting, trapping, fishing, multi-use trail activities, picnicking, and wildlife or nature observation. Support facilities that





enhance nature-based outdoor recreation and/or improve disabled accessibility access such as roads and parking lots are also eligible for Stewardship funding. Program funds are reimbursed on a 1:1 state-local cost-share basis, and grant applications are due May 1, 2020.

The Recreational Trails Program is a federal program administered in all states. Municipal governments and incorporated organizations are eligible to receive reimbursement for development and maintenance of recreational trails and trail-related facilities for both motorized and non-motorized recreational trail uses. Eligible sponsors may be reimbursed for up to 50 percent of eligible project costs. Funds from this program may be used in conjunction with funds from several other state grant programs.

### Recommendation

Parks' Interim Executive Director recommends retroactive authorization to apply for a State of Wisconsin Stewardship and the Federal Recreational Trails Program grants.
