Subject: Easement Request from MCImetro Access Transmission Services for an Underground

Telecommunication system within the Root River Parkway (ACTION)

Issue

Authorization to execute a twenty-five year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal with MCImetro Access Transmission Services (MCImetro) to allow for the construction, operation, and maintenance of an underground telecommunication system across parkland.

Background

Declaratory rulings by the Federal Communications Commission and subsequent state law prohibit local governments from adopting regulations or taking actions that prohibit or have the effect of prohibiting wireless or wireline telecommunication services.

The easement requested serves Small Wireless Facilities (SWF) on Root River Parkway. All installation work will be underground and installed by MCImetro and their contractors. Permission for installation work is granted through the Parks Right-of-Entry permit process. Granting the permanent easement is necessary for the long-term operation of the utility and requires authorization from the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors and the County Executive.

The easement is for twenty-five years with one (1) ten-year renewal. The fee for the easement is five dollars per lineal foot and includes an annual 3% increase. The lineal footage of the easement is 3,812 and the first-year fee will be \$19,060. The annual fee will be equally distributed between the trail maintenance trust and the playground trust.

Recommendation

Parks' Executive Director recommends authorization to prepare, review, approve, execute, record and/or implement the required documents or perform actions required to grant a twenty-five years easement with one (1) ten-year renewal for underground telecommunications to MCImetro for the construction, operation and maintenance of the electric





service in Root River Parkway. It is further recommended that that the County Executive and County Clerk be authorized to execute any required documents to effectuate this easement.

(ITEM NO.) From the Executive Director of Milwaukee County Parks, requesting authorization to grant MCImetro Access Transmission Services a twenty-five-year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal for an underground telecommunication system within the Root River Parkway, by recommending adoption of the following:

A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, MCImetro is requesting a twenty-five-year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal on parkland to place an underground telecommunications system (fiber optic cable, conduit, and ducts) and surface line location markers within the Root River Parkway, to increase the reliability of telecommunications systems; and

WHEREAS, under Federal and state law, local governments cannot adopt regulations or take actions that prohibit or have the effect of prohibiting wireless or wireline telecommunication services; and

WHEREAS, this requested easement is related to Small Wireless Facilities on Root River Parkway that have been approved under the state regulatory framework; and

WHEREAS, MCImetro has requested that Milwaukee County grant a twenty-five-year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal to allow for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the underground telecommunication system and is offering an annual fee of \$5.00 per lineal foot, which will increase by three percent annually as compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Parks Interim Executive Director has reviewed this request and based on the requirements of federal and state law related to small wireless facilities, recommends that MCImetro be granted a twenty-five-year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal for the construction, operation, and maintenance of an underground telecommunication system and related improvements within the Root River Parkway; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes Milwaukee County Parks, the Department of Administrative Services, the Register of Deeds, Corporation Counsel and Risk Management to prepare, review, approve, execute and record all documents, and take all actions as required to grant MCImetro the twenty-five-year easement with one (1) ten-year renewal for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the attached underground telecommunication system and related improvements within the Root River Parkway; and

46	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that MCImetro will pay an annual fee of \$5.00 per
47	lineal foot, which will increase by three percent annually as compensation for the

51	the annual fee equally between the trail maintenance trust fund and the playground
