Effective in 2002 75 the Friday after the fourth Thursday in November shall be a holiday for nonrepresented employees and employees who are represented by a collective 76 77 bargaining unit which has agreed to this provision. All county departments, offices 78 and institutions shall be open to the public for business on all other statutory holidays. All employees, including those in the building and mechanical trades group in 79 80 subsection 17-32(2)(c) [sic], except employees paid on an hourly or per diem basis 81 and firefighter and equipment operators who receive off days in lieu of holidays and assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting who receive off hours in lieu of 82 83 holidays, shall be granted leave with pay on these days, provided that if an employee 84 is required to work on such days because of the needs of the service, he shall be 85 given equivalent time off or shall receive additional compensation, if such 86 compensation is authorized by the provisions of subsection 17-16(5). Firefighter and equipment operators, who receive seven (7) off days in lieu of all holidays, shall be 87 granted such off days during their first calendar year of employment as provided for 88 89 in their collective bargaining agreements. Assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting, who receive one hundred nine (109) hours of holiday time in lieu of 90 91 holidays, shall be granted fifty-four and one-half (54.5) hours, or one-half (1/2) of the

- annual allotment, on January 1st of each year and the second half of the annual 92 93 allotment, fifty-four and one-half (54.5) hours, on August 1st of each year.
