15 16 17 18	WHEREAS, the U.S. DOJ requires the qualifying localities to negotiate a Memorandum of Understanding regarding the administration and distribution of funds; and
19 20 21	WHEREAS, the following localities are eligible for funding in the total amount of \$826,377: the City of Milwaukee (the City), Milwaukee County (the County), and the City of West Allis; and
22 23 24 25 26	WHEREAS, funding is awarded to municipalities based on the average annual number of Part 1 violent crimes reported by the unit to the Federal Bureau of Investigation; and
20 27 28 29 30 31	WHEREAS, since the County bears the cost of prosecution and incarceration that arise out of Part 1 violent crimes, the U.S. DOJ has declared the County a disparate jurisdiction, and therefore eligible to share in the funding awarded to municipalities located within the County; and
32 33 34 35	WHEREAS, it was agreed that funding would be split evenly with the Milwaukee Police Department and the County, each funding one-half of the cost of the Community Justice Council Director position, housed at the Wisconsin Policy Forum in an amount totaling \$113,070; and
 36 37 38 39 40 	WHEREAS, the City and the County may split evenly the net amount of funds after the Wisconsin Policy Forum Community Justice Council Director is paid for equally between the two; and
41	WHEREAS, the grant does not require a local match; and
42 43	WHEREAS, the County will be the fiscal agent for the grant; and
44 45 46	WHEREAS, in order to meet the grant requirements, a separate trust fund must be established to deposit the grant monies which the County will receive; and
