AN ENGROSSED RESOLUTION

Authorizing and directing the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Culture to change the name of Wahl Park to Harriet Tubman Park and processing a fund transfer request in the amount of \$9,750 from Org. Unit 1800-1945 – Appropriation for Contingencies to an appropriate account within Org. Unit 9000 – Department of Parks, Recreation, and Culture

WHEREAS, Wahl Park is located in the City of Milwaukee, near West Hampton Avenue and North 47th Street; and

WHEREAS, Wahl Park contains many amenities for the community including a wading pool, basketball court, pavilion, children's play area, and several acres of green space; and

WHEREAS, Wahl Park was created in 1956 and named after Christian Wahl, the first President of the Board of City Park Commissioners and architect of the Milwaukee County Parks System, along with Charles Whitnall; and

WHEREAS, the area surrounding Wahl Park is primarily residential and its many amenities provide valuable recreation opportunities to the nearby neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, the Wahl Park neighborhood and surrounding neighborhoods are primarily home to communities of color; and

WHEREAS, rethinking the conventions of naming monuments, statues, landmarks, and parks is important as national conversation has examined the reasoning behind a chosen name; and

WHEREAS, the naming of a monument reflects who and what we think is important, as well as our values as a community; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County is committed to ensuring that its monuments, including its parks, are named after those individuals or communities that reflect our County's dedication to racial equity; and

41	WHEREAS, Harriet Tubman was born Araminta Ross, later adopting the
42	name Harriet after her mother, Harriet Ross, and Tubman from her first husband,
43	John Tubman; and

45	WHEREAS, Harriet Tubman was one of the most successful conductors of
46	the Underground Railroad, a network of secret routes and houses used to help
47	enslaved peoples escape into free states and Canada, and is credited with
48	helping over 13 missions and assisting in the freedom of over 70 people; and

50	WHEREAS, Harriet Tubman was also instrumental throughout the Civil
51	War, vehemently opposed to the Confederacy, and was the first woman to lead an
52	armed assault during the Civil War; and

54	WHEREAS, throughout her life, Harriet Tubman was a noble activist, later
55	committing to the cause of women's suffrage and equality; and
56	WILEDEAC according to the Wisconsin Historical Conjete the
57	WHEREAS, according to the Wisconsin Historical Society, the
58	Underground Railroad had secret routes and houses in Milwaukee to help
59	individuals escape to other northern states and Canada; and
60	WUEDEAS covered leastions in Milwaukes were manumental during the
61	WHEREAS, several locations in Milwaukee were monumental during the
62	years when the Underground Railroad was active, including a station known as
63 64	<u>Deacon Samuel Brown's farm on North 16th Street and West Fond du Lac Avenue</u> near the Milwaukee County Transit System administration building; and

66	WHEREAS, neither Milwaukee, nor Wisconsin, would be involved in the
67	vital work of the Underground Railroad without the contributions of Harriet
68	Tubman; and

70	WHEREAS, Harriet Tubman is reflective of the community in which Wahl
71	Park resides and deserving of this recognition; and

73	WHEREAS, because the Wahl Park and surrounding neighborhoods are home to
74	communities of color, its park should reflect its own residents; and

76	WHEREAS, the Committee on Parks, Energy, and Environment, at its meeting of
77	September 11, 2020, recommended adoption of File No. 20-548 (vote 5-0); now,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes and directs the Department of Parks, Recreation, and Culture to change the name of Wahl Park to Harriet Tubman Park; and

therefore,

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Office of the Comptroller is hereby
authorized to process a fund transfer in the amount of \$9,750 from Org. Unit 1800-1945
