## A RESOLUTION/ORDINANCE

To amend Section 17.17(3) of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances to change all minor County employee holidays to major holidays to reduce costs; and establish Christmas Eve Day as a major holiday and eliminate Election Day as a paid holiday

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County must find creative solutions to address its ongoing budgetary structural deficit, whereby costs-to-continue are rising faster than revenues, but Milwaukee County continues to seek a fair deal partnership from the State to have a fair and sustainable local government finance regime (File Nos. 18-944, 19-161, and 19-831); and

WHEREAS, major holidays in which County operations may be closed include: January 1, the third Monday in January (Martin Luther King Jr., Day), the last Monday in May (Memorial Day), June 18 (Juneteenth Day), July 4 (Independence Day), the first Monday in September (Labor Day), the fourth Thursday in November (Thanksgiving), and December 25 (Christmas); and

WHEREAS, minor holidays in which County operations are still open, but staff who work these hours will be credited with holiday pay include: the third Monday in February (Presidents Day), March 31 (Cesar Chavez Day), November 11 (Veterans Day), the Friday after the fourth Thursday in November, and the day of holding the General Election in November which is recognized in even numbered years; and

WHEREAS, according to a memorandum from the Office of the Comptroller dated August 20, 2020 (heretofore attached to this file), if all Milwaukee County minor employee holidays were converted to major holidays, the County would save approximately \$120,000 per year; and

WHEREAS, as part of Milwaukee County's ongoing mission to achieve racial equity, Juneteenth (June 19) was established in 2020 as a major employee holiday (File No. 20-463); and

WHEREAS, most Wisconsin Counties are closed on December 24 while the City of Milwaukee and State of Wisconsin mark that day as an employee holiday as well; and

WHEREAS, subsequently the Register of Deeds and County Clerk are unable to contact the State Registrar on December 24 regarding vital records, and the courts are closed except for custody intake, therefore County employees are not fully able to effectuate all the public services it provides; and

WHEREAS, it is not necessary for County employees to have a minor holiday on Election day as Wis. Stat. § 6.76 allows for all Wisconsin electors to be absent from work for up to three hours so long as the employer has been properly notified and no penalty may be imposed on the employee except for a pay deduction for the time absent; and

WHEREAS, Assistant Chiefs of Airport Firefighting, who have a standard 52-hour workweek, also require an update to the ordinances to reflect changes made in recent years (i.e. Cesar Chavez and Juneteenth Days) that were made without adjusting holiday time for these five positions; and

WHEREAS, Milwaukee County continues to find cost-savings wherever possible as its duty to County taxpayers and so money can be most effectively allocated to provide the services County citizens expect and deserve; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Personnel, at its meeting of December 1, 2020, recommended adoption of File No. 20-762 (vote 4-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, beginning in 2021, all minor Milwaukee County employee holidays shall be observed as major holidays, December 24 shall become a major holiday, and Election Day will no longer be a County employee holiday in even numbered years; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Section 17.17(3) of the Milwaukee County Code of General Ordinances shall be amended to reflect the transition of making County employee holidays major rather than minor, creating a holiday for December 24, and eliminating Election Day as an employee holiday by adopting the following:

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The County Board of Supervisors of the County of Milwaukee does ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1**. Section 17.17(3) of the General Ordinances of Milwaukee County is hereby amended as follows:

8182 17.17 – Vacations and Holidays

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111 112 (3) The following days of each year are holidays and county departments, offices, and institutions may be closed on these holidays: January 1, the third Monday in January, the third Monday in February, March 31, the last Monday in May, June 19, July 4, the first Monday in September, November 11, the fourth Thursday in November, the Friday after the fourth Thursday in November, December 24, and December 25., the day appointed by the governor as Labor Day, and the day of holding the general election in November, unless as otherwise may be provided for by collective bargaining agreements; county departments, offices, and institutions may be closed on these holidays: January 1, the third Monday in January, the last Monday in May, June 19, July 4, the first Monday in September, the fourth Thursday in November, and December 25. Effective in 2002 the Friday after the fourth Thursday in November shall be a holiday for non-represented employees and employees who are represented by a collective bargaining unit which has agreed to this provision. All county departments, offices, and institutions shall be open to the public for business on all other statutory holidays. All employees, including those in the building and mechanical trades group in subsection 17-32(2)(c) [sic], except employees paid on an hourly or per diem basis and firefighter and equipment operators who receive off days in lieu of holidays and assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting who receive off hours in lieu of holidays, shall be granted leave with pay on these days. provided that if an employee is required to work on such days because of the needs of the service, he shall be given equivalent time off or shall receive additional compensation, if such compensation is authorized by the provisions of subsection 17-16(5). Firefighter and equipment operators, who receive seven (7) off days in lieu of all holidays, shall be granted such off days during their first calendar year of employment as provided for in their collective bargaining agreements. Assistant chiefs of airport rescue and firefighting, who receive one hundred nine thirty-six (109) 136) hours of holiday time in lieu of holidays, shall be granted fifty-four and one-half (54.5) sixty-eight (68) hours, or one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) of the annual allotment, on January 1st of each year and the second half of the annual allotment, fifty-four and one-half sixtyeight (54.5 68) hours, on August 1st of each year.

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SECTION 2. The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon January 1, 2021.

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
