

Safety and Justice Challenge Grant Project Manager Contract, by recommending adoption of the following:

A RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2016, Milwaukee County (the County) received from the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation a funding award notice for the Safety and Justice Challenge Phase II Implementation in the amount of \$2,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the award period is from May 1, 2016, through April 30, 2018, with the possibility to extend an additional year; and

WHEREAS, on May 26, 2016, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors (County Board) adopted File No. 16-271, which authorized the Chief Judge to accept the Safety and Justice Challenge Phase II Implementation Grant from the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation (16-1601-150542-CJ) for the Safety and Justice Challenge Phase II; and

WHEREAS, on December 15, 2016, the County Board adopted File No. 16-679, which authorized the Chief Judge to issue an 18-month contract for the Safety and Justice Challenge Project Manager position; and

WHEREAS, on December 20, 2018, the County received a funding award notice for the Safety and Justice Challenge Phase III Implementation and Community Engagement Grant (Phase III) in the amount of \$2,300,000; and

WHEREAS, the Phase III application included the position of Safety and Justice Project Manager for the duration of the grant; and

WHEREAS, the Safety and Justice Challenge Project Manager will continue to be administratively located at the Wisconsin Policy Forum as part of the Milwaukee Community Justice Council; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of December 10, 2020, recommended adoption of File No. 20-900 (vote 7-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors does hereby authorize the Chief Judge, First Judicial District, Combined Court Related Operations, to issue a 20-month contract from January 2021, to August 2022, not-to-exceed \$167,627 with the option to extend pending additional funds made available by the John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation.
