254 One (1) representative from Milwaukee area technical college's basic life (n) 255 support education program. 256 Term of office. Each voting member of the council shall serve for a term of two (2) (4) 257 years, with the exception that any elected official appointed to the council shall serve for the term of his/her elected office. 258 259 Vacancies and alternates. A vacancy occurring because of resignation or other valid (5) 260 reason will be filled, for the unexpired term, by appointment of a successor, in the 261 same manner that council members are appointed. All meetings of the council and its standing committees shall (b) 292 be publicly announced and open to all citizens, as required by s. 19.82 et seq., Wis. Stats. 293 294 Standing committees. In order to accomplish its work, the EMS council shall (C) have the following standing committees: operations; medical advisory (medical 295 society of Milwaukee); guality assessment and improvement; public education; 296

- and executive. Committee membership may include council members and/or
 nonmembers, but each committee shall be chaired by a member of the council.
 The presiding officer may appoint other select committees as he or she deems
 necessary.
- 301 (d) *By-laws.* The council shall adopt appropriate by-laws incorporating Robert's
 302 Rules of Order, Revised Edition. Elected officers shall serve for a term, as
 303 determined by the council's by-laws. A majority of the voting members of the
 304 council shall constitute a quorum.
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306 Section 8. The provisions of this ordinance shall become effective upon passage and307 publication.

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
