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Report from the Director, Department of Health and Human Services, seeking approval to process an administrative appropriation fund transfer to increase expenditure authority and revenue budget and establish a capital project for the Mental Health Emergency Center, by recommending adoption of the following:

AN AMENDED RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, for the past decade, the Behavioral Health Division (BHD), Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), has been engaged in a long-term transition to a more community-based continuum of care for residents needing mental health and substance use treatment and services; and

WHEREAS, a psychiatric emergency department provides tremendous value to the community; and

WHEREAS, to continue to meet this need, Milwaukee County (the County) has partnered with four private health systems to create a new Mental Health Emergency Center (MHEC); and

WHEREAS, through a unique public-private partnership, area private health systems have agreed to subsidize 50 percent of the operational deficit of the MHEC; and

WHEREAS, the construction costs of the MHEC facility will be shared between the County and health system partners, with an expected total cost of \$12.2 million; and

WHEREAS, the County is receiving a \$640,000 credit for land value of the proposed site at 12th Street and Walnut Street, on the northern end of the existing parking lot that serves the Marcia P. Coggs Center; and

WHEREAS, the health system partners have agreed to fund \$200,000 in accelerated construction costs; and

WHEREAS, the County's share of the construction costs of the MHEC facility is \$5,360,000; and

WHEREAS, the construction contracts will be held by MHEC, Inc.; and

WHEREAS, annual debt service related to the bond financing will be included in the BHD-DHHS operating budget; and

WHEREAS, the County will reimburse MHEC, Inc., for capital construction expenses; and

WHEREAS, the County maintains a self-imposed annual bonding limit as defined in the resolution adopted in File No. 03-263, representing a three percent increase over the prior year's adopted bond base and the proposed fund transfer may cause the County to exceed its self-imposed annual bond limit by \$5,360,000; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Finance, at its meeting of March 18, 2021, recommended adoption of File No. 21-314 as amended (vote 6-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, the Office of the Comptroller, and the Office of Performance, Strategy, and Budget, Department of Administrative Services, are authorized and directed to process an administrative appropriation transfer to create expenditure authority of \$5,360,000, and revenue budget for general obligation bonds/notes of \$5,360,000 for newly created Capital Project WE123012-Mental Health Emergency Center:; and

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Milwaukee County shall not exceed its self-imposed bonding limit in 2022 pursuant to the policy established in File No. 03-263, and the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors will reduce other capital expenditures accordingly to accommodate the addition of the capital project in this file.
