Community Resilience Fund

Provides time-limited funding to support community and neighborhood efforts focus on responding and healing from the direct and indirect of COVID-19.

Service Delivery | *Programming*

Assist residence in stabilizing their lives after experiencing impacts caused by the outbreak. These activities may include, but are not limited to, job training programs for the recently unemployed or mental health services for residents who have been traumatized.

Education & Awareness | *Public Information*

Outreach, Information, and Services in multiple languages on resources and strategies related to COVID-19 and relief efforts: to reach the diversity of the Milwaukee community using tools such as video, social media, and partnerships with ethnic media.

Community Resilience Fund

System & Infrastructure Improvement | *Operation Support*

In-language counseling, technical assistance and/or financial relief to small businesses and non-profits: to mitigate economic loss and support increased need for services in areas such as (but not limited to) reopening or adapting business models to operate in alignment with social distancing and stay-at-home orders.

Community Capacity Building | *Empowerment*

Neighborhood organizing. Mobilize residents, non-profits, and small businesses atrisk of eviction and default for collective action and policy change, organization and management of mutual aid funds, and other community driven strategies to provide relief and mediation as needed.

Mental Health Fund Awardees

- Response to increased need for food
- According to Feeding America, "the majority of network food banks report seeing a record increase in the number of people needing help.
 - Food banks see an average increase of over 55% more of our neighbors visiting food banks than before the pandemic.
 - Roughly 4 in 10 people visiting food banks had not received food assistance before the pandemic."



Food Program Funding

An allocation of \$1.4 million was made to increase food security across the County.

Milwaukee County allocations:

- \$686,411 to Feeding America Eastern Wisconsin
- \$752,370 to the Hunter Task Force

Food Program Funding

Examples of items purchased:

- refrigerated cargo vans
- portable heaters and miscellaneous COVID related food distribution equipment/supplies for 42 emergency food pantries
- commercial grade equipment to improve kitchen facilities for two soup kitchens.
- In addition, the Hunger Task Force purchased a semi-tractor to move, hold and deliver food across the County as well as PPE, plastic bags, clamshells, and boxes for re-distribution within our network.
