REQUEST

Adoption of the Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for Southeastern Wisconsin 2021-2025 as prepared by SEWRPC.

BACKGROUND

The Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) for Southeastern Wisconsin is intended to make the region and its county and local governments eligible for grant funding from the U. S. Department of Commerce - Economic Development Administration (EDA). The CEDS was prepared jointly by the M7 (Milwaukee Regional Economic Development Partnership) and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission (SEWRPC). The project area includes Milwaukee County and the six surrounding counties that make up the southeastern region of Wisconsin: Kenosha, Ozaukee, Racine, Walworth, Washington and Waukesha. Each county is considering the plan for adoption.

REPORT

The CEDS sets forth the following economic development vision: *Southeastern Wisconsin is to be a globally competitive region that fosters innovation, collaboration, sustainable prosperity, and a high quality of life for all.* The plan specifically cites economic resilience and equity as key factors to achieving success. Strategies are built around five goals:

- 1. Unity
- 2. Growth
- 3. Talent
- 4. Livability, and
- 5. Infrastructure

The plan provides data to identify the Region's EDA-defined economically distressed areas and helps ensure they quality for EDA grant programs. Recommended projects include workforce, (re)development, infrastructure, and housing needs including expansion of bus-rapid transit, investment in the 30th Street Corridor and other projects throughout Milwaukee County and the region.

The latest version of the CEDS was drafted during the COVID-19 pandemic. Public engagement and comment opportunities were hosted virtually by SEWRPC and their municipal members.

RECOMMENDATION

In order to strengthen efforts to secure Federal funding for projects that have a focus on economic development, particularly projects that will benefit economically distressed areas, it is recommended that the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors adopt the CEDS as prepared by SEWRPC.
