1 By Supervisors Clancy, Shea, Rolland, Johnson, Jr., File No. 21-599 2 Cullen, Taylor, Ortiz-Velez, and Czarnezki 3 4 **A RESOLUTION** 5 6 In support of immigrants, refugees, and asylum-seekers; calling upon the United States 7 Federal Government to create a pathway to citizenship for undocumented immigrants 8 9 10 WHEREAS, in the base of the Statue of Liberty resides a bronze plaque 11 depicting Emma Lazarus' 1883 sonnet which concludes: 12 13 "Keep, ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she 14 With silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor, 15 Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free, 16 The wretched refuse of your teeming shore. 17 Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me, 18 I lift my lamp beside the golden door!" 19 20 ; and 21 22 WHEREAS, Milwaukee County values the contribution its immigrants have made 23 in the past 150 years and has recently demonstrated that by: 24 25 In File No.12-135, the County established a limited policy by which Milwaukee 26 County would respect detainer requests on what are called "non-resident," "undocumented," or "illegal aliens" from the United States Department of 27 28 Homeland Security – Immigrations and Customs Enforcement (ICE); and 29 • In 2018 the County stated its unambiguous opposition to the President of the 30 United States' "zero tolerance" policy whereby the federal government 31 intentionally separated children from their families (File No. 18-549); and 32 In File No. 19-273, the County supported the ability of all Wisconsin residents, 33 regardless of immigration status, to be able to acquire a driver license to facilitate 34 identification, discourage targeting by local law enforcement, and enable workers 35 to get to their jobs and support the economy 36 37 ; and 38 39 WHEREAS, the last major comprehensive federal immigration legislation was the 40 Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, signed into law by President Ronald

Reagan, which among other things, enabled lawful permanent residence and eventually

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the possibility of citizenship to those without lawful residency and work status and no significant changes to the immigration system have occurred since then; and

WHEREAS, immigrant workers and the children of immigrants have filled many of the "essential" jobs during the COVID-19 Pandemic, among others, keeping Milwaukee County grocery stores stocked with food and other general goods stores supplied, meanwhile an April 1, 2021 *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* article titled, "Easter's timeless message of hope and renewal seems particularly timely as churches cautiously return to normal," reported that Milwaukee's dense south side immigrant neighborhoods saw the most COVID-19 cases in the City of Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS, the need for employees in the Wisconsin economy is real and it is time for those hard workers who contribute to American society and pay taxes without representation, the ability to fully participate in society; and

 WHEREAS, Article 1 of the 1947 United Nations Universal Declaration of Human Rights, adopted by the United States, declares, "All human beings are born free and equal in dignity and rights. They are endowed with reason and conscience and should act towards one another in a spirit of brotherhood."; and therefore all immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers, regardless of employment, educational attainment or other status, deserve dignity and representation; and

WHEREAS, the Committee on Intergovernmental Relations, at its meeting of July 15, 2021, recommended adoption of File No. 21-599 (vote 4-0); now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, Milwaukee County hereby calls upon the United States Federal Government to treat undocumented immigrants, refugees, and asylum seekers with dignity and to implement the following by appropriate legislative or executive action:

• Create a pathway to citizenship for approximately 11 million undocumented immigrants

Maintain the principle of unifying families in the family visa program
Improve the US refugee and asylum systems so all individuals may have their cases adjudicated in a timely manner

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, Office of Government Affairs staff is authorized and requested to communicate the contents of this resolution to federal policymakers, and support legislation that achieves the criteria outlined in this resolution.

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
