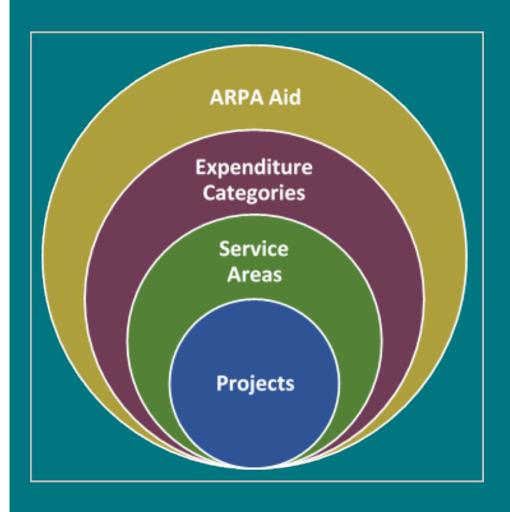

PROCESS FOR MAKING TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATIONS

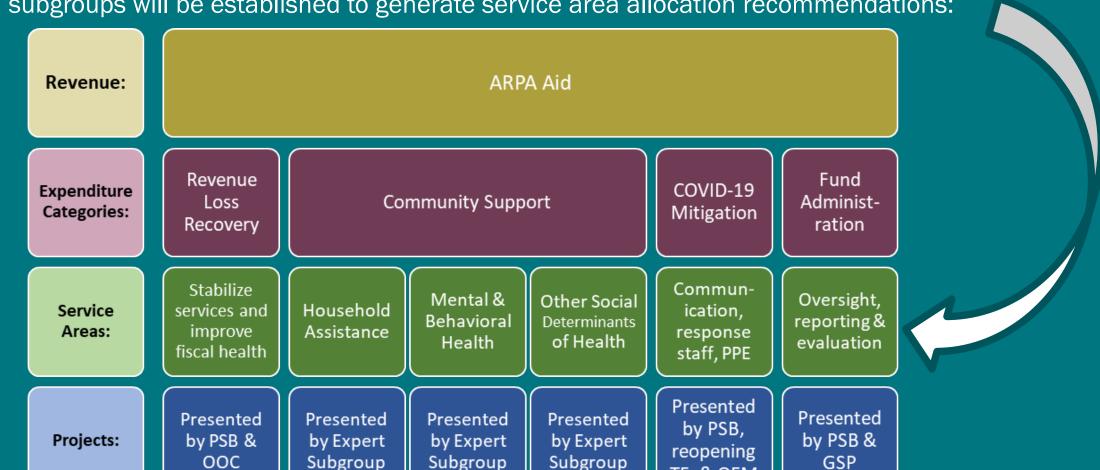
Levels of Recommendation



- ARPA Aid: Allocations determined by U.S.
 Department of the Treasury
- Expenditure Categories: Allocations recommended by the Milwaukee County ARPA Task Force
- Service Areas: Allocations recommended by the Milwaukee County ARPA Task Force
- Projects: Authorization to allocate funds is approved by Finance Committee and the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors

- Emergency requests should be presented to the ARPA Task Force for recommendation simultaneous with submittal to Finance Committee to eliminate delays.
- The process may be repeated minimally every six months or as often as needed

EXPENDITURE CATEGORY CRITERIA

Criteria for Expenditure Categories

Presentations by Service Area subgroups to the ARPA Task Force should demonstrate alignment with criteria specific to the expenditure categories:

Revenue Recovery	COVID-19 Mitigation	Fund Administration
Impact on county fiscal health (longevity and totality)	Allows for flexibility needed to quickly respond to pandemic needs	Satisfies a requirement set forth by the U.S. Department of the Treasury (i.e., evaluation)
Measure of projected cost- savings or revenue generation	Stabilizes staff needed for pandemic response in county service areas	Allows for sufficient human resources to manage oversight and reporting requirements
Limited term (1-3 year) investment	Proactively prepares the county to continue services throughout a pandemic	Accounts for indirect costs associated with administering the fund

Criteria for Expenditure Categories Cont.

Presentations by the **Community Support Programs** Service Area subgroups to the ARPA Task Force should demonstrate alignment with the following criteria:

Mandatory Criteria

Does not require ongoing financial commitment or sustainable funding after 2024

Requires a limited term (1-3 year) investment for implementation

Was not implemented, in the proposed state, prior to the pandemic

Fits into one of the following Expenditure Categories:

E2) Negative Economic Impacts;

E3) Services to Disproportionately Impacted Communities; E4) Premium pay

Prioritized Criteria

Addresses an immediate pandemic-related need or will have a system-level impact on the upstream social determinants of health

Intentionally increases equity

Is an evidence-based strategy

Outlines trackable performance indicators (long term-goals, objectives, outcomes, and outputs)

Aligns with the strategic vision and efforts of Milwaukee County strategy teams

Maintains a data collection plan, including demographic information for all expenditures (including contracts/subcontracts)

Is informed by community input and/or builds capacity of community organizations

Has been coordinated with local or state partners and/or includes matching funds or resources

Creates employment opportunities for Milwaukee County residents
