- A. Approval of this resolution would appropriate \$100,000 from Org. Unit 1940-1945 Appropriation for Contingencies to Org. Unit 9010 Department of Parks, Recreation and Culture Administration for the stated purpose of recruiting parks positions like lifeguards and seasonal staff.
- B. This resolution provides a one-time \$100,000 outlay from the Appropriation for Contingencies fund.
- C. The budgetary impact for 2021 increases the expenditures and revenues of the Department of Parks, Recreation and Culture by \$100,000. This resolution does not authorize or obligate further allocations beyond the funds authorized in this resolution. The current balance of the Unallocated Appropriation for Contingencies account is \$4,950,000 as of October 20, 2021. This was reported at the November 1, 2021 meeting of the Committee on Finance in File No. 21-36. Use of funds from the Appropriation for Contingencies either decreases the County's overall surplus at year's end or increases its deficit.
